We all aspire to eat from the "Tree of Life" but we don't always find the path that leads us there, and when we do succeed to walk that path, we might also stumble and fall on the way.

In a series of discussions and study sessions Rabbi Dov Berkovits, a teacher and author who lives with his family in Shillo, Israel, will lead us on a spiritual journey that will allow each of us to deepen our understanding of our personal goals and aspirations as we walk, each in our own way and all of us together on "the Path of the Tree of Life".

Human society in the 21st century faces new and far reaching challenges – for many of us the "corona episode" has sensitized us to the unique spiritual and moral climate in this dramatic period in human history. We live in a new era of global communication and commerce, of asymptotic development of new technologies, of superficial interactions in the social media with the accompanying loss of the ability to create meaningful relationships and experience intimacy. There are unceasing attempts to recreate the meaning of gender and what it means to have a coherent sense of personal identity.

These and other central aspects of contemporary human consciousness require a powerful language of personal meaning and spiritual aspiration that can only come from a deeper understanding of God's Torah given as a gift to the People of Israel and as an invitation – a calling out – to all peoples to "choose life" as He intended.

In the first three chapters of the Torah in the story of Creation and the Garden of Eden, Hashem described for all of us the contours of the human condition – the meeting of heaven and earth in the human spirit, the dialogue between body and soul, human freedom and responsibility, man and woman and the bridge that needs to be built between our basic drives and our need for spiritual inspiration.

We will explore together the balance that we choose to create within ourselves between eating from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil and eating from the Tree of Life, and its implications for some of the basic building blocks of Hashem's invitation to "choose life" – Shabbat and shmita, the moral challenge of creative speech, the holiness in marriage, personal meaning and fulfillment in the workplace and in commercial interaction and leadership for life enhancement.



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
